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Academic Writing and Referencing

- **Academic Integrity:**
 - Referencing properly gives credit to the original sources of information, ideas, and theories used in the writing.
 - This demonstrates respect for intellectual property and avoids plagiarism, which is a serious academic offense.
- **Support for Arguments:**
 - Referencing provides evidence and support for the claims, analyses, and conclusions presented in the academic work.
 - It allows readers to verify the information and follow up on sources if needed.
- **Credibility and Persuasiveness:**
 - Enhances credibility of the work, as it shows that the information is well-researched and properly attributed.
 - This can make the arguments more persuasive and compelling to the reader.
- **Situating the Work:**
 - Situates the work within the broader academic discourse and intellectual tradition.
 - Demonstrates familiarity with the relevant literature and their ability to engage with existing knowledge.
- **Facilitating Further Research:**
 - Allow readers to easily locate and access the sources cited in the work.
 - Aids in further research and scholarship building on the writer's work.

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Background of the Turabian Referencing System

- **Background:**
 - Widely used in social sciences, including history, sociology, philosophy, and religion.
 - Provides a standardized way to cite sources and format academic papers, ensuring consistency and proper attribution of ideas and information.
- **In-text citations:**
 - Author-date style: (Author's last name, date)
 - Note style: Superscript numbers in the text that correspond to footnotes or endnotes.
- **Reference list or bibliography:**
 - Entries are listed alphabetically by the author's last name.
 - Each entry includes the author's name, title of the work, publication information (publisher, date, etc.).
 - The format varies depending on the type of source (book, journal article, website, etc.).
- **Formatting:**
 - Double-spaced text with 1-inch margins.
 - Title page, table of contents, lists of figures/tables, etc.
 - Consistent use of headings, subheadings, and indentation.

	4+ authors	(First author's last name et al. Year, page numbers)	(Thomas et al. 2020, 96-99)
	Editor or translator listed in place of author in reference list	(Editor's or translator's last name Year, page numbers)	(Doyle 1987, 200)

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The Function of the Bibliography

1. **Attribution and Acknowledgment:**
 - It provides a comprehensive list of all the sources used and cited in the academic work.
 - This gives proper credit and acknowledgment to the authors, researchers, and publications that have contributed to the ideas and information presented.
2. **Verification and Credibility:**
 - It allows readers to verify the sources used in the work and evaluate the quality and reliability of the references.
 - This enhances the overall credibility of the academic work.
3. **Further Research and Exploration:**
 - It serves as a roadmap for readers to explore the literature and sources related to the topic.
 - It facilitates further research by providing the necessary information to locate and access the cited sources.
4. **Transparency and Accountability:**
 - It demonstrates the writer's transparency in their research process and accountability for the information presented.
 - It shows that the writer has engaged with the relevant scholarly literature and supports their arguments and conclusions.
5. **Compliance with Academic Standards:**
 - Adhering to a specific referencing style (e.g., APA, MLA, Chicago) to meet the required academic standards
 - This is often a crucial requirement in academic institutions and publications.
6. **Demonstration of Scholarly Engagement:**
 - It reflects the depth and breadth of the writer's engagement with the field of study.
 - Showcases the writer's familiarity with the existing literature and their ability to situate their work within the broader academic discourse.
